

I wanted to submit my newest trophy that I was able to take in Russia. I hunted with **ProfiHunt** once again to take a mid-

Caucasian tur. This gives me one of each of the three different tur the Russian Caucasus has to offer. Each hunt was an adventure in itself and I have to thank the crew at ProfiHunt for making each of them a successful and exciting adventure. My interpreter on this hunt was Alexey Maximov, as it was on my Kuban (Western) tur hunt. Alexey had a great team of locals lined up for me and I was able to take my trophy on the first day of hunting. We started climbing well before daylight to be in position at first light. We quietly glassed over the top of a ridge just as the sun was cresting to find two tur feeding 157 yards away. A quick discussion and two shots later I had my heavy-horned 12-year-old tur down. I have to say I was a little shocked at how fast it all happened. It was a
