



Vladim Gomzyakov (Russia) took this Altay argali from Mongolia in October 2006.




This fantastic Hangay argali from Mongolia was taken by Vadim Gomzyakov (Russia) in October 2010.




This Esfahan mouflon was taken in Iran by Vadim Gomzyakov (Russia) in February 2009.

Vadim Gomzyakov (Russia, right) scored with the Alpine ibex from Austria in September 2012.




This Sindh ibex from Pakistan was taken by Gomzyakov (Russia) in February 2008.






This beautiful Altay ibex was taken by Vadim Gomzyakov (Russia) in October 2009.

Beceite ibex. After those first two ibex, he just couldn't stop thinking about these mountain-dwelling goats. So, in 2008 he was able to get a Sindh ibex and Kuban (Western) tur from Pakistan and Russia.

In 2009, he traveled to Iran to collect a Persian desert ibex and then on to Mongolia in October 2009, where Vadim took the Altay and Gobi ibex. Vadim rounded out his 2009 hunting calendar when he took a mid-Asian ibex in Kazakhstan in November.

In April 2010, Vadim hunted in Austria and was able to bag an Alpine ibex and an Alpine chamois. The next hunting trip Vadim took to get to the Capra World Slam started in March 2012 when he got a Himalayan ibex from northern Pakistan, and then he traveled down to New Zealand and got the chamois and the tahr for his efforts. This actually brings Vadim to a total of 13 Capras, and we certainly hope he will continue after these mountain creatures.
