
HOBSON REYNOLDS • May 3, 2011

Highlights: For this hunt, we started out for a day hike into the mountains and it ended up being four long days on the mountain above base camp.

Species: Mid-Caucasian tur Date Taken: May 3, 2011

Highlights: On this hunt there were snowstorms, fog, and sheer cliff free climbing. I was pushing back against the cliff wall so hard that I got no rest at all for my 352-yard shot at a 45° uphill angle. It made my tur leap forward and flip, tumble and slide halfway down the mountain with some airborne trips lasting 40 to 50 yards! Amazingly, no discernable damage was present. My local guide, Moyet, was pleased with my effort, which of course pleased me.

Species: Kuban (Western) tur Date Taken: May 6, 2011


Location: Caucasus Mountains, Karachayevo-Cherkesiya, Russia

Outfitter: ProfiHunt - Vladimir Koshcheev

Highlights: I was able to make a 336-yard shot at a 10° up-angle shot. This hunt had brutal climbing in order to take my tur. I suggest you put your tur in the spotting scope prior to the shot if able, to show your guide which one to watch when shooting into a large group. With the lack of communication the only way, otherwise at the shot the tur are everywhere.
