

John Gulius (PA) was seen earlier with a report about his three turs from the Caucasus Mountains of Azerbaijan and southern Russia. When John documented his Ovis World Slam in the Spring issue of OVIS, we used a couple of Mongolian argali reports, a Marco Polo and a Blanford urial from Pakistan. John has also been after the snow sheep the last couple of years and he had this to say about his Koryak, Kamchatka and Kolyma snow sheep hunts:

My Koryak snow sheep hunt took place in September 2008 in Russia with Eugeny Kharitonov and ProfiHunt. I was lucky to get this ram on the next-to-last day of the hunt, as it rained and we had fog on the last day. This was the only ram with one other that we saw the whole trip. There were six hunters in two separate camps. We all got sheep, but it was tough going.

I also hunted Kamchatka snow sheep in Russia during September 2008 with ProfiHunt. This was the second of the two hunts I did at the same time (the first was for the Koryak snow sheep). My luck on this hunt didn't seem to be any better than the first. Again it was the next-to-last day of the hunt and this lone ram was the only animal of any kind that I had seen. It for sure is not huge, but I can always go back again someday.
