



We are happy to report that 2015 Weatherby Award winner **Barbara Sackman** (NY) reached the Capra World Slam Super 30 on a hunt in Karachayevo-Cherkesiya, Russia during September 2017. The species Barbara took to accomplish this milestone was a Caucasian chamois. Barbara shot it on the last day of the hunt and with time pressing to get to the airport, it had to

be retrieved by her guide, **Artem Veselov**, from **ProfiHunt**. No worries though, because Artem did photograph Barbara's retrieved chamois and forwarded it on.
