Highlights: We traveled the first week of August to the Caucasus Mountains. The weather was sunny and warm, which in combination with a full moon were not the best conditions for lots of activity during the day. After the first day, we decided to make spike camp on top and use horses since we were making over 1,200 meters/4,000 feet in positive elevation to get to the tur area. Animals were as high as they could be, and we only saw a few billies, only the one I shot was worth it. I passed three other younger billies (7-9 years) and shot this one on the fifth hunting day. We got to 350 meters of the cave where



it was bedded, a gorgeous 13-year-old beast.

peast.
The chamois population, despite
how beautiful the terrain was, is really

low, so expect to see only a couple of chamois per day if you can hike. We connected on this mature 6-year-old buck the first day we focused only on chamois. They are lower than tur and we didn't see any during the other hunting days. My uncle came only to hunt for chamois and shot a really old, busted, full of resin, forest buck, on the afternoon of the second day. Organization by ProfiHunt was perfect in all fields and we had an amazing time in Russia!

Suggestions: If you are heading

Suggestions: If you are heading there in summertime, be ready for warm temperatures and a lot of hiking. Tur are as high as they can be, and will only move really late in the afternoon or early mornings. If you would like an old trophy, pass the young ones, since local guides tend to want you to
